The Grain Trade Standards Workshop has been designed for grain trade classification staff, grain merchant and grain producers who receive, assess and manage grain storage. The program is designed for personnel responsible for the operation of receival sites and industry participants who require an understanding of classification and segregation of grain. The program provides a detailed understanding of the trade requirements for on-farm storage and handling to meet trade requirements for domestic and international markets. The workshop runs for two days, providing participants training in:

- The application of relevant Trading Standards for cereal grain, oilseeds & pulses
- The correct procedures for operating a receival site/storage facility
- The grain classification process; weighbridge and documentation activities and information required to safely receive and store grain.
- The correct use of equipment and assessment techniques
